Central Texas Education Nonprofit Brings Community Together Through Learning

More than 400 volunteers participate in Breakthrough Central Texas summer programs

AUSTIN, TEXAS – From July 24 – 26, 2019, local education nonprofit Breakthrough Central Texas will host five opportunities for the public to interact with students during Experience Breakthrough Presentations of Learning. More than 300 community volunteers have already committed their time to helping students, grades six to 12, demonstrate their knowledge and skills, with more needed by the July 24, 2019 kick-off date.

Each summer, Breakthrough students, advisors and AmeriCorps Teaching Fellows work together to ensure students receive out-of-school learning and leadership experiences. As part of the Breakthrough model, the summer programs supplement students' in-school learning and help them develop leadership skills. Students in grades six to eight work on in-depth academic projects in core subjects, while ninth graders immerse themselves in Breakthrough's STEM academy and students in grades 10 to 12 focus on acquiring life skills that will aid in their success during college and beyond. Students will go on to become the first in their family to earn a college degree.

As the culmination of Breakthrough's summer program, students at each grade level share the knowledge and skills they have developed by participating in Presentations of Learning. Community volunteers are asked to provide essential feedback on student presentations. No training is needed, and volunteers are encouraged to attend during their lunchtime, as a meal is provided.

"We are so appreciative of the time community members choose to invest in our students," says Breakthrough Central Texas Volunteer Coordinator Elvira Marin. "It is overwhelming to see how many individuals are passionate about seeing these students succeed academically. We are really working together to build a brighter future for Austin." More than 800 middle school students and hundreds of high school students will share the knowledge and skills they have acquired during Presentations of Learning. In total, more than 400 community volunteers are needed.
