AUSTIN, TEXAS – Breakthrough Central Texas, Austin's nonprofit organization that helps students become the first in their family to earn a college degree, will host a virtual public event aimed at encouraging community conversation and activism to combat racial, social, and education inequity on November 17, 2020 at 5:15 p.m. "<u>What Now? Race, Class & Educational Equity: A Community</u> <u>Conversation with Wes Moore</u>" will be hosted by Breakthrough Central Texas Executive Director Michael Griffith and live streamed for free on the organization's <u>Facebook</u> page, <u>YouTube channel</u>, and website.

Featuring performances from Grammy-award nominee and social entrepreneur SaulPaul, the virtual event will include an introduction from Griffith and keynote presentation from Moore. One of today's most respected voices and fiercest champions for educational equity, Moore's first book, *The Other Wes*

Moore, a perennial *New York Times* best-seller, drew the nation's attention to the fine line between success and failure in our communities and in ourselves. That story has been optioned by executive producer Oprah Winfrey and HBO to be made into a movie. He is also the author of the best-selling books *The Work, Discovering Wes Moore,* and *This Way Home*.

Following Moore's presentation, Griffith and Moore will engage in a live Q&A, featuring questions posed by attendees. Pre-registration is available for the event now at <u>breakthroughctx.org/community-</u> <u>conversation</u> and registrants may enter questions for the speaker upon registration.

"At Breakthrough Central Texas, we know all children should have the opportunity to benefit from the life-changing power of a college degree," says Griffith. "But we are also keenly aware of the deep-rooted, systemic racism and income inequality that keep far too many students from attaining post-secondary success. While we do not have all the answers to combat these social injustices, we are committed to partnering with advocates like SaulPaul and Wes Moore to take the next steps in the search for answers and solutions. Our hope is that parents, students, teachers, and individuals across Central Texas and the nation will join us for this first event to see what we can accomplish next when we work together."
