Why We Exist: The Hard Reality in Central Texas

Our region is experiencing an ever-widening economic divide, the results of which mean a deep-rooted and pervasive cycle of poverty. A cycle that has little chance of being broken without aggressive and effective intervention.


Nearly two-thirds of new jobs in Central Texas require a post-secondary degree. Yet, only 6% of middle school students from low-income communities in Central Texas will earn a post-secondary degree of any kind.

The value of a college degree is the increased earning potential of the person who earns it. It's the lasting ripple effect through an entire family and neighborhood, as friends and community members are themselves inspired to follow their own vision. It's the impact on an entire region and economy, as educational attainment closes the opportunity gap and decreases social and economic inequity.

And the path to a college degree? That's where Breakthrough comes in.

Who We Serve

In 2017, Breakthrough will serve 1,450 students, in sixth grade through college, from Austin ISD, Manor ISD and Del Valle ISD. Our student body is a diverse community united by one common qualifier: every student in the program will be the first in their family to graduate from college.









The Breakthrough Experience Generates 4x the Number of Graduates

At the core of our model are three main pillars. Each pillar provides students skills and experiences that address the three critical factors that limit academic success and persistence: unequal out-of-school academic opportunities, the lack of a knowledgeable personal advocate and the development of leadership skills.

Extended Learning

Breakthrough extends the amount of learning each student receives outside of school by offering academically challenging summer programs, after-school tutoring, Saturday enrichment programs and SAT/ACT preparation. We also offer college-financing counseling and individualized college guidance.

Comprehensive Advising



Leadership Experience

These experiences include internships with leading companies like Samsung and Bazaarvoice, the challenging opportunity to teach younger Breakthrough students, a two-week personal project and innovative ways that build character and broaden horizons.
