

## Research Study with Latino/Hispanic Youth and Parents at the University of Texas at Austin

Are you a **parent of a high school student** or **a high school student ages 14-17** who identifies as Latino/Hispanic?

We are a research group at the University of Texas-Austin conducting research with the goal of supporting the health and well-being of Latino/Hispanic youth and families. We would love your help!

We are conducting focus groups through Zoom where parents and students will discuss their experiences with discrimination and prejudice. Our hope is to use this information to design a family-based curriculum to help Latino/Hispanic families successfully manage experiences with prejudice and discrimination.

- What:
  - One 60 90 minute virtual Focus Group meeting via Zoom
  - 5 to 10 participants per focus group
    - One focus group will be parents only, while one focus group will be high school students only
- Who:
  - o Latino/Hispanic parents of high school students
    - Each parent participant will receive a \$40 gift card for participating
    - Each parent participant could receive an additional \$10 for referring an eligible friend who also participates in a focus group
    - Parents can participate without their child
  - o Latino/Hispanic high school students (ages 14-17)
    - Each student participant will receive a \$30 gift card for participating
    - Each student participant could receive an additional \$5 for referring an eligible friend who also participates in a focus group
    - Students can participate without their parent
- When:
  - On a date and time that is convenient for you
- Why
  - To support the healthy development of Latino/Hispanic youth and families
  - To hear about youths' and parents' experiences with facing discrimination and prejudice in school, the workplace, or the community
  - To develop a curriculum that can help support Latino/Hispanic youth and families
